

Then to Intergetau Jumontai Shishin Shiju Kyo," an ancient Chinese mirror with triangular tims which is decorated with gods and animals. According to a Chinese chronolele, Himiko, the queen of Yamatsikoku kingdom was given 100 bronze mirrors by a Chinese emperor of the Wei Dynasty in A.D. 239. This bronze mirror might be one of them.
